A Word from our Pastor

*Let mutual love continue. Do not neglect to show hospitality to strangers, for by doing that some have entertained angels without knowing it. Remember those who are in prison, as though you were in prison with them; those who are being tortured, as though you yourselves were being tortured. Let marriage be held in honor by all and let the marriage bed be kept undefiled; for God will judge fornicators and adulterers. Keep your lives free from the love of money and be content with what you have; for he has said, "I will never leave you or forsake you." ... Do not neglect to do good and to share what you have, for such sacrifices are pleasing to God. **Hebrews 13:1-5;16***

The writer begins with some hefty guidelines for the Jewish Christians if they are to live fully into their faith in Jesus Christ. Jesus' followers are to love one another, welcome strangers, visit prisoners, be faithful in marriage, be content with their financial resources, and finally, remember and imitate their past leaders. (Remembering their Jewish ancestry was more than sentimentality for the Jewish people; it was a crucial and defining piece of their covenant love relationship with Jehovah God.)

The list in those verses was a gauntlet of challenges for those first-century Christians, and it holds weighty significance for us today. We find encouragement in God's promise to his people that gives us strength and comfort in his words, "I will never leave you or forsake you." Jesus, at his ascension, told his hearers, "... and lo, I am with you always, even until the end of the world."

We're called to be encouragers to each other, hospitable with each other, share mutual affection with each other, and live lives that are expressions to God's perfect and unconditional love. Yesterday, today, and forever will be just enough time to begin to appreciate the vastness and splendor of God's love for all humanity. Yesterday, today, and forever, we are invited to praise the One whose name we confess, and honor God through our lives well-lived. May our actions point others to him, our words praise him, and our lives demonstrate the love and life-giving grace that Jesus shares so freely with us.

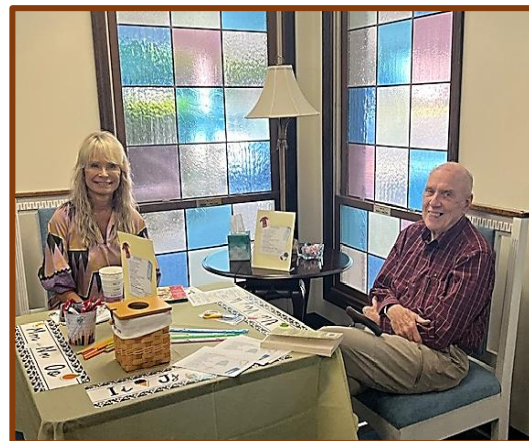
