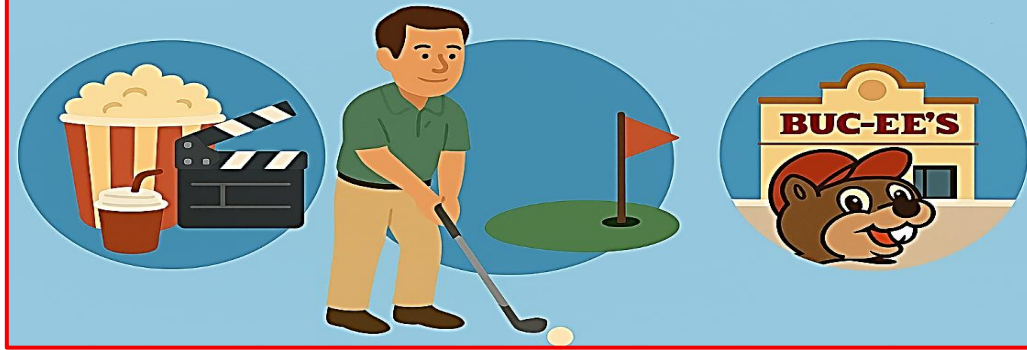


*Lafayette Orchestra Spring Recital, May 1*
