A Word from Our Pastor

The one who enters by the gate is the shepherd of the sheep... When he has brought out all his own, he goes ahead of them, and the sheep follow him because they know his voice. They will not follow a stranger, but they will run from him because they do not know the voice of strangers. John 10: 2; 4-5

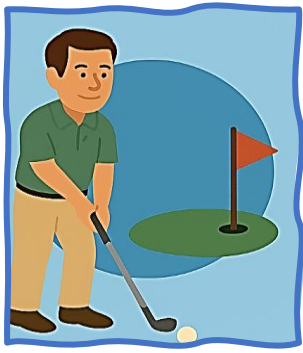
My daughter, Elizabeth, and her husband, Michael, live on a farm in Frankfort. Last summer, they added sheep to their livestock, and the ewes have been lambing since late February. One ewe is a first-time mother and is trying to reject her lamb. This means that, every day, at least twice a day, Elizabeth or Michael must go out into the field and bottle feed little Oreo. The little lamb recognizes them, trusts them, and has begun to run to them, knowing they bring warm milk and gentle hands.

When I visited last week, the flock was in a pasture near the driveway. Ewes casually grazed in the shade of an enormous elm tree as their lambs lay close by on the grass. I couldn't resist walking to the fence to get a better view of the growing flock, but as I came near, mamas roused their young and bolted deeper into the field. I was a "stranger," and they weren't taking any chances. (I'd obviously been rejected but didn't take it personally.)

It wasn't long before Elizabeth appeared beside me with her two young boys. In spite of Boone's peals of delight and Jed's gurgling, the sheep slowly returned to the shade and resumed their grazing; some even approached the fence where their "shepherd" stood. They recognized her voice and drew near.

The scene reminded me of the verses from John's Gospel, "... the sheep follow (their shepherd) because they know (their shepherd's) voice." May you hear the voice of your Shepherd this week, and may it bring you comfort, guidance, and peace.
