A Word from Our Pastor

“The King will reply, ‘Truly I tell you, whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did for me.’ Matthew 25: 40

Sometimes, if I’m paying attention, I get to experience for myself a poignant, real-life illustration for a sermon I’m preparing. Such was the case on Mother’s Day weekend when I went to Home Depot to buy herbs.

I chose not to get a cart - my way of limiting my purchase to only what I could carry in both hands. I found the “short” line with only one person in front of me and waited to check out. The sun was shining, the air was crisp, and birds chirped their merry chirps, swooping and darting from the top of one shelf to another.

In the lane beside mine, a young lady struggled to check out. She fumbled with her wallet and dropped some plastic pots that rolled several feet in different directions. People behind her held their places in line, pretending not to notice her predicament, so I shifted my items to one hand and stepped out of line to help her retrieve two containers that were still rolling. She smiled, embarrassed, and we exchanged remarks about getting home to pot our plants. The entire incident lasted less than thirty seconds.

Just as I stepped to return to my place in line, a young man with a cart full of items pushed his way ahead of me and proceeded to place his items on the scanner. “Whatever,” I thought to myself, and got in line behind him. The wait to pay wasn’t long, and I stood happily sniffing my mint and rosemary.

As I stepped to the register, the same lady returned to thank me. “You really didn’t have to do that,” she said. “It cost you your place in line.”

“I didn’t mind at all,” I replied with a smile. “You’re worth it.”

“You have no idea how much I needed to hear that today,” she whispered. “Thank you for seeing me -- and helping me.” With that, she walked away.

I took my receipt and walked to my car thinking... *She thanked me for seeing her!* Those three simple words, “*You’re worth it,*” touched something tender in that stranger that day. It was only a brief encounter, but it was a powerful one.

We never know when we’ll have an opportunity to meet someone’s very deep need. It may be in the simple act of picking up a runaway flowerpot; or seeing someone - really *seeing* them - and dignifying their personhood with a smile or speaking a few words of affirmation. We never know when we’ll have the opportunity to minister to someone... and gaze into the image of Jesus. May we each be so blessed!
