A Word from Our Pastor

Be still before the Lord, and wait patiently for him. Psalm 37:7

“Why did the chicken cross the road?” Every state has its own answer to that riddle. In Kentucky, the answer is, “...to show the white-tail deer it can be done.” In Louisiana, it’s “...to show the armadillo it can be done.” In Vermont, it’s “...to show the raccoon it can be done.” You get the idea.



On my way to work this morning, a rather large gaggle of geese chose to cross the road - with their young goslings. Drivers in both directions stopped to let the birds waddle their way to the other side, which took a good little while. The adult birds were in no particular hurry, and flanked their little ones in front and behind, allowing them to set the pace.

In addition to marveling at the birds themselves and the way these geese protected their young, I couldn’t help but notice the expressions on the faces of other motorists who had come to a complete stop, allowing the procession to pass. Strangers smiled and nodded at each other and gave the “thumbs up” sign to drivers in opposite lanes. Some stepped out of their cars to video and snap pictures.

The moment lasted less than five minutes. It was a gentle reminder that waiting patiently while being still opens our consciousness to the beauty and wonder of life all around us. These birds, with strong, expansive wings, dared to cross a road *on foot*, with their young - and in the process, brought rush hour traffic to a standstill. I, for one, appreciated the opportunity to “be still ... and wait patiently...” in that holy moment.

I pray you will take - or *make* - the opportunity to “be still” this week and simply wait patiently on God to reveal himself to you. It may be in a sunset, the song of a bird, the fragrance of your flowers, a star-strewn night sky, or the embrace of a friend. If the world seems heavy and sore to you right now, set it down; be still in the moment, and wait... patiently... on the Lord who is waiting patiently on *you* to be present to him.

You're invited to join the Wildcards for a morning of card making and creativity on **Tuesday, July 14, at 9:30 a.m.** Whether you

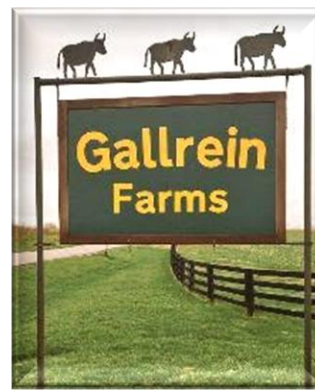
are experienced or just curious, enjoy the fun as we make cards to brighten someone's day.
