### *A Word from Our Pastor*

We all need to hear these words. They celebrate Christ's resurrection and offer comfort and assurance about our future as Christ-followers.

Doing the right thing *with joy*, speaking truth *in love*, and choosing to follow the Risen Christ who holds our future can be challenging - and unpopular at times. Today's Christian believers throughout the world are experiencing hateful intimidation, discrimination, and oppression. We can't imagine what it's like for them to live as human targets of political and religious persecution. What a way to live.

That's exactly Paul's point when he wrote to the Christians in Rome, "For I consider that the sufferings of this present time are not worthy to be compared with the glory which shall be revealed in us." (18:8) He considered his own trials to be temporary rather than eternal. Jesus' resurrection reminds us that we need not spend our days in fearful anticipation of what's to come. We have hope and a "calm assurance" that we can face uncertainty knowing that the loving and trustworthy One who promised our ultimate victory holds us, holds our future in his hands.

Each one of us is on God's "mission team." We get to do the kingdom work of Christ amidst and despite the brokenness of humanity. God's work. Our hands. And a life this side of glory that "... is worth the living because He lives."

May the Spirit of the Risen Christ strengthen and encourage you - and draw you into a deeper awareness of his love and faithfulness.

## Mission Moment

*Faith Fellowship seeks to become the hands and feet of Christ in the world through engagement in missions.*

The more the Mission Team members learn about Angel Tree Camp, the more we are impressed with the goals and successes of this wonderful program and the effect it has on children of incarcerated parents.



The counselors receive trauma-informed care training designed specifically for children of incarcerated parents. This training helps counselors build safe, nurturing environments so campers can feel secure enough to open up about the multitude of problems they face each day. It gives extensive preparation to help children process difficult emotions, build trust, and overcome the unique challenges associated with having a parent in prison. It helps ensure that each child has the support they need.

One in 49 children in America has a parent in prison. Having an incarcerated parent can trigger long-lasting emotional, developmental,

and financial challenges. They suffer from stigma and isolation; they often withdraw socially, have lower self-esteem, and face bullying.

Campers often describe their experiences at camp as finding a relatable “family” where they can express emotions, feel less alone, and escape daily worries. They enjoy being around and becoming comfortable with others who face the same problems they face. Learning about Jesus and his love and understanding helps them feel cared for regardless of circumstances. They leave camp armored with The Word.

Incarcerated parents emphasize that camp helps their children realize they are not alone and allows them to connect with others like them and to process their feelings. They are grateful that camp gives their kids a chance to just be kids, get to experience the outdoors and traditional camp activities like group games, horseback riding, and swimming. They also appreciate the Christian-focused environment that nurtures their children through Bible study provided by caring adult counselors who are supportive role models.

“Camp is where kids are cared for uniquely, where they meet others from similar backgrounds, and where counselors remember their names and let them know they’re seen and valued.”

“My favorite thing about camp is probably just the people here,” one camper shared, “because everyone’s super nice and the activities are also super-duper fun.”
