Remember when we were kids and wrote notes and letters to boyfriends, girlfriends, and other special people? Sometimes, beneath our names, we'd add x's and o's to indicate kisses and hugs. It seemed a cute, yet "safe" way to express our affection. As a young adolescent, adding a single x and o to a note felt almost scandalous - like holding hands in a darkened theatre. Any PDA was strictly forbidden - *especially* in church! Young people going steady were expected to sit at least a hymnal-length apart during worship services, under the scrutinizing glares of parents, the pastor, and Ms. McGraw, the 10th grade Sunday School teacher.

It hasn't been so long ago that each of us was keeping our own distance from each other. After months of worshipping online, mandates were finally lifted. We began to re-gather on Sunday mornings, but there were no handshakes, no hugs, and no physical closeness. In spite of the masks that covered our faces, our gladness and smiles of affection shown through our eyes.

Now, I get to watch you come in the doors on Sunday morning and clasp the hands of others, smile, and embrace each other in greetings of Christ-like love and affection. I see you hugging each other and it's not unusual to see men slapping each other on the back. We are made for community, and when we come together for worship, we are joined by the Risen Jesus who is reflected in each other's faces.

Paul's words to those Corinthians sure seem like a lot of x's and o's to me. Greeting someone with a kiss on the cheek was a convention of his time and culture, but his message was clear: Love each other; show honor and respect for each other; remember that the Risen Christ communes with us - and his Spirit gathers us to himself.
